Communion

In the Anglican/Episcopal tradition, communion is received in two kinds: in the bread and in the wine.

The bread is offered first and is placed in one's opened palm with the words, "The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven." The bread may then be consumed.

A chalice bearer will then offer the wine with the words,
"The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation."
As the cup is presented, please either take the cup from the chalice bearer or gently take hold of the base of the chalice, helping the chalice bearer to guide it toward your lips.


Please note: We do not practice intinction here at Christ Church (dipping the bread into the cup of wine).

We do this for two reasons: to avoid fingers dipping into the wine, and to avoid bread crumbs falling into the chalice.

If you do not wish to receive the wine, cross your arms in front of you when the cup is offered. Gluten-free hosts are available; please ask if you need one. Acolyte/EM: light the candles 10 minutes before the start of the service. Light the Paschal candle first, if present, then the lectern side, second altar candle and the two candles at the raredos.

Acolyte/EM processes with the cross; waits at the altar to be joined by the clergy; all bow to the altar; the deacon will step back and allow the Acolyte to walk over to the cross stand and secure the cross. Typically the A/EM will sit behind the lectern, but this is optional.

First Reading

Isaiah 25:1-9

O Lord, you are my God; I will exalt you, I will praise your name; for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure. For you have made the city a heap, the fortified city a ruin; the palace of aliens is a city no more, it will never be rebuilt. Therefore strong peoples will glorify you; cities of ruthless nations will fear you. For you have been a refuge to the poor, a refuge to the needy in their distress, a shelter from the rainstorm and a shade from the heat. When the blast of the ruthless was like a winter rainstorm, the noise of aliens like heat in a dry place, you subdued the heat with the shade of clouds; the song of the ruthless was stilled.

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear. And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; he will swallow up death forever. Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken.

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

Acolyte/EM: check with the person giving the homily if that person wants the Book of Readings removed from the lectern after the Gospel reading. Some, like the deacon, will put their sermon notes on top of the Book to bring it withing reading range of their bifocals.

Deacon/Presider **People**

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Matthew 22:1-14

Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, 'Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet.' But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, 'The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet.' Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. "But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

D/P The Gospel of the Lord. **People Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

The deacon will return the Gospel book to the Altar. As the deacon climbs the steps you may join the deacon to bow at the altar. After bowing, the deacon will either proceed to the lectern to give the homily and you will proceed alone to the first row of chairs/pew, or both you and the deacon will proceed to the first row of chairs/pew and listen attentively.

After the homily join the clergy in returning to the sanctuary.

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

The Holy Communion

Presider

Walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself

for us, an offering and sacrifice to God. (Ephesians 5:2)

Please rise as the bread and wine and money we offer to God for our nourishment and crosses herself. and the life of the world are brought forward and presented at the altar.

Use hand-cleaner:

Set the veiled chalice on the center of the coporal.

Set the missal stand to the left of the coporal.

Bring the gluten-free container to the deacon

By this time the Deacon will have removed the burse, paten and linen; wait for the deacon to hand it to you to return those items to the credence table.

After the collection, ushers will bring bread and wine to the deacon; the deacon will remove the stopper from the wine and hand it to you to set on the credence table. Bring the water cruet to the deacon, who will add a small portion to the wine and wine cruet. If you are so-inclined you can carry the bowl and towel at the same time.

After setting the table, the deacon will step aside to allow the presider to wash her hands. Return the towel, bowl and cruet to the credence table. Return to the altar and stand one pace behind and to the left of the presider. Mimic the movements of the presider as she bows and crosses herself.


Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People** It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The Presider continues:

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace.

But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation.

Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said:

"Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you.

Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said:

"Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

Presider:

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever.

Presider And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

The Lord's Prayer

All

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Breaking of the Bread

A period of silence is kept.

Presider Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.

Presider The Gifts of God for the People of God.

Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him

in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

All are welcome to receive Holy Communion.

The presider will serve bread to the deacon and EM, then serve wine to the deacon, who in turn will offer the chalice to the EM. The EM will follow the presider and serve the wine, pausing to allow enough time for the recipients to eat enough of the bread to indicate that they are ready for the wine.

The deacon will fill the second chalice and serve the congregation on the right side of the rail (in front of the bishop's chair.)

Bishop Rickel has asked that congregants not intinct the bread. (Typically, I'll whisper to the person that we don't intnct because that puts gluten into the wine, spoiling it for those who are gluten-free.)

Use the purificator to wipe the rim of the cup firmly and turn the cup a full one quarter turn before offering wine to the next communicant. Each time you complete your 'altar rail pass', carefully wipe the entire rim before beginning again.

Use a fresh surface of the purificator each time you wipe the rim; it is ok to pause, place the chalice on the corporal (or ask someone to hold the chalice) and refold; take the extra purificator from the burse if the one you are using becomes too soiled. Insofar as possible, keep the purificator neatly folded.

The words of administration of the wine are, "The blood of Christ, the cup of salvation". If intincting, EM says 'the body and blood of Christ'.

After commuion, the deacon will hand you the items on the altar to be returned to the credence table.
